



Steps to Follow After Your Bike Has Been Stolen

- 1) File a police report.
 - a. The following are your options for filing a police report, beginning with the most effective way and ending with the least effective way:
 - i. Go to your local district police station in person. Bring any information you have about your bike (e.g., serial number, SAFE Bikes registration number, bike photo, receipt). You can find your local district SFPD station here:

 - ii. File an online report. Include any information you have about your bike (e.g., serial number, SAFE Bikes registration number, bike photo, receipt). You can file an online SFPD report here:

 - iii. Call to file a police report. Include your serial number and SAFE Bikes registration number. The SFPD non-emergency number is (415) 553-0123.
- 2) Email or call SAFE.
 - a. You can reach us at info@sfsafe.org or (415) 553-1984.
 - b. Please include your name and SAFE Bikes registration number and/or serial number in your email, or have one of those numbers handy if you call. This is so we can update your bike's status as stolen in our registry.
- 3) Check the Stolen Bike Registry:
